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A Still More Excellent Way

We often call February "love month" because Valentine's Day falls in the middle of it. Though not on the same scale as Christmas, this is one of those occasions when gifts are exchanged in the name of love, honor, and affection. 1 Corinthians, Chapter 13 is often called "the love chapter." This text is often read at weddings, but its message applies much more broadly than just to the love between spouses. We should really try to bring this kind of love to all of our relationships. The preceding chapter of 1 Corinthians (Chapter 12) speaks of gifts from the Holy Spirit and ends with the transitional verse "But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way." (1 Corinthians 12:31, NRSV). In Chapter 13, Paul tells the Corinthians (and us) that we can have all manner of gifts and reason to boast, but if we do not have love, those gifts that we might have are worthless.

In the words of Ralph Waldo Emerson, "The only gift is a portion of thyself." Christ gave himself for us, and sent to us the Holy Spirit with its gifts to help us to be better able to give back to Christ and to the body of Christ on Earth, the church. Through our sharing of our gifts, we show Christ-like love to one another, and to our Lord and Savior. *To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good (emphasis mine).* (1 Corinthians 12:7 – NRSV).

The idea of "the common good" means that we give of

ourselves and our gifts, talents, and resources to benefit not just others, and not just ourselves, but **both** ourselves **and** others. Achieving or working toward common good requires some give and take. There is a joke about give and take: "We have a give and take relationship. I just give and he/she just takes." That is not a path to a balanced and healthy relationship. Sure, there are occasions when we give to someone who appears to not be in a position to give directly back. But, virtually all of us have something to give to the community, even if we cannot directly reciprocate to an individual who has given to us. By everyone giving into the larger community, and all receiving from the larger community, each of us can feel the value of our contribution and also receive the benefit of the collective community.

Christ gave himself as the ultimate gift of his love and affection for us. We, too, are called to give in Christ's name, and in that same spirit of love and affection, loving <u>everyone</u> as Christ does. Through the Holy Spirit, we are equipped to give in ways that make the body of Christ more whole. Without you bringing and giving of your God-given gifts, the body of Christ (the church) is less complete than it will be with your addition to it. Without your siblings in Christ bringing their gifts, your opportunity for living an abundant life in Christ is diminished.

For this reason, I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within ... for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. (2 Timothy 1:6-7, NRSV)

In 1976, Johnny Cash recorded the humorous song "One Piece at a Time," a story about putting together a Cadillac by getting one piece at a time over a number of years. Christ's church is also put together one piece at a time. You are a piece, and I am a piece, and our siblings in Christ all are pieces, too. Some pieces, the church got long ago. Other pieces have come more recently. All of these pieces are needed to put together Christ's church. Unlike the unsightly Cadillac in the song (with one tail fin and three headlights - two on the left, and one on the right), we are made most beautiful and complete in and through our variety. Christ is our Master Mechanic and you are a needed part in what he is putting together. The Holy Spirit has "stamped" you with a "part number"...

But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues.

(1 Corinthians 12:18,27-28 - NRSV)



Our Benevolence for the Month is HIV/AIDS Work at Ahuas Clinic



AIDS at the Ahuas Clinic, which includes IAC treatment (intensive adherence counseling) every two months, as well as counseling, emotional support, and additional medical admission and home visits as needed. As the clinic is able, it also supports the cost of patients' travel to Puerto Lempira, where the government hospital is located, for testing and specialist visits. HIV / AIDS patients should visit Puerto Lempira every six months, but cost is prohibitive (about \$120 per trip), so many patients make the trip once per year instead. Donations to the HIV / AIDS work at the Ahuas Clinic support medication and staffing costs related to treatment, as well as the cost of travel to Puerto Lempira."
